

This year the DNI was fortunate to have not one but two patients who decided to sky dive in order to raise fund for the DNI as well as our Parkinson's research department.

Yvonne (pictured right) completed a sky dive for the DNI and as a result raised €10k. We reached out to Yvonne to ask her about her sky dive & what it meant to her, see below.

"I was diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease (young onset) by the Dublin Neurological Institute nearly five years ago. Following a very informative & constructive consultation with Prof.

Timothy Lynch he asked would I assist in fundraising for PD research.

Being more than delighted to help in a very positive manner I immediately consulted my "bucket list" and chose Sky Dive , something I'd always wanted to do.

Combining this fundraising idea with my 60th birthday party and jumping with my son Luke from 13,000 feet , I managed to raise €10,000 for the DNI.

For myself, it showed I could still be active and useful despite my illness. I am currently under the care of Prof. Richard Walsh, who has been extremely supportive of me on my PD journey."

Nicola (pictured on the right) is a patient who is currently taking part in our freezing of gait research project in which she received a Parkinson's assistance dog named Nemo (also pictured left) to help with movement and to prevent freezing.

Nicola along with her friends and family completed a sky dive to raise funds for our Parkinson's research department in the DNI.

As a result Nicola along with her family and friends raised over €7k



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RESEARCH

Research in the DNI has really ramped up in the past year with the expansion of our Research Team and the beginning of some new and exciting research projects. Over the year 150+ people volunteered to participate in a number of ongoing research studies with themes including, eye tracking, Parkinson's Assistance dogs, Balance and Brain activation, as well as Deep Brain Stimulation. While some studies kicked off during the year projects were wrapped up, and the results of these research projects were shared far and wide through conferences, congresses and even radio programs!

The upcoming year also looks to be full of innovative new research endeavours spanning new research themes and using novel technologies. This year we are joined by Master's Student, Tom from Trinity College Dublin, who will carry out research into causes and predictors of Falls during activities of daily living using motion sensors and pressure sensing insoles. As well, Research Registrar Eoghan, will begin his MD research through the exploration of new novel technologies in optimizing treatments and assessing the benefits of Deep Brain Stimulation.

We have a number of exciting research opportunities for people to take part in during the coming year, covering a wide range of topics.

- Falls Modeling: Explaining and predicting the cause of Falls in People with neurological Conditions.
- Understanding challenges in Battery Charging in rechargeable Deep Brain Stimulators.
- Evaluating differences patterns of Eye Movement in Parkinsonian Related Conditions.
- · Quantifying Changes in speech and Gait with Deep Brain Stimulation, using novel Technology


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SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT
